Freedom of Information legislation has been absolutely pivotal for the Give Them Time Campaign - it has enabled us to verify parents' anecdotal accounts of the disparate processes used by local authorities to assess so-called "discretionary" deferral requests and the wide-ranging average approval rates of these across the country. Without this data, we would have been unable to challenge local and national policies as forcefully.

In 2018/19 the media made up 7% of requesters appealing to the Commissioner, compared to 11% in the previous year. Rob is a regular user of FOI to conduct investigations and write stories for the media on controversial issues. He also contributed to a [journalists' letter](#) [9] in 2017 calling for action to be taken on the Scottish Government's FOI performance. He will talk about the value of FOI for journalists and writers like him.
